### Green Teas

Unfermented Chinese green teas are loved for their diversity of taste and type. Having a high vitamin and mineral content, they are also popular with health-conscious consumers.

### Hysson

A green tea from Azores, rich in tannin with a very pleasant taste and an intense fragrance.

### Jasmin

A green tea with flavoured jasmine blossoms and a fresh bouquet.

### Saudades Do Kobé

A special grade tea with a delightful flavour, and a honey-coloured infusion.

## Black Teas

The oxidized leaves of the Camellia Sinensis give origin to the following black tea varieties. A healthy beverage rich in vitamins and minerals, providing special fragrances and flavours, and moments of relaxation and pleasure.

### Reid's Blend

A light and satisfying cup of tea at any time of the day.

### Ceylon Pettiagalla

An exquisitely tasting tea. Long wiry leaves, aromatic and flowery, with a golden yellow infusion.

### Darjeeling Second Flush

By excellence it is the ideal tea for the afternoon. Originating from the high regions of the Himalayan mountains in India, it is aromatic, has a pronounced flavour, amber colour and is full-bodied.

### English Breakfast

A blend of rich leaves in equal proportions of the Assam, Darjeeling and Ceylon varieties, strong in colour and flavour, refreshing in any occasion.

### Assam Hazelbank

Considered by experts as being one of the best ranges of Assam, it is a stimulating tea with a full-bodied flavour and golden amber colour.

### Earl Grey

An aromatic tea with bergamot oils. It has a pleasant citrus aroma.

## *Infusions*

### Rooibush

A pure unblended tea from the South African Rooibos bush, caffeine-free and rich in antioxidants.

### Fruit Garden

A flavoured fruit melange with an apricot and peach taste.

### Raspberry

A flavoured fruit melange with a raspberry flavour. Organically certified.

### Black Currant

A flavoured fruit melange with a black currant flavour

### Original Honeybush

A traditional South Africa tea with a delicately sweet character.

### Green-Mate

Native of the South America it is an infusion prepared from the Mate Herb, with a slightly bitter flavour. It is a stimulating drink with caffeine content.

### Lemon Grass

The hallmark of this Thai variety is its mild lemon-like flavour.

## Lapacho

An infusion prepared from the inner bark of the South American Lapacho tree, it is an infusion with medicinal properties and has a robust flavour.

## Camomile

These specially selected Egyptian varieties, with their high oil-content, produce a strong tasting tea with a deep yellow infusion.

## Nana-Mint

This plant captivates with its refreshing flavour and aroma. It became well-known due to the ethereal-oil contained in its leaves.

## Verbena

This highly aromatic Verbena with its fresh lemon character is one of the most famous herbal infusions.

## Lemon Verbena

Delicious infusion prepared from the leaves of a shrub native from Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil. Lemon verbena leaves have a sweet lemony flavour.
